introducing the FDA Disabled Members Network

What is the FDA Disabled Members Network?

A recognised equality and diversity network group for any FDA members who consider themselves to be disabled or who have an interest in disability matters.

The main purpose of the network is to improve access to disability support and information for members; to provide a forum to discuss and work together on issues of concern; to connect members with services and expert advice; to develop solutions to common barriers; and to promote the inclusion of disabled people in the civil service and wider society, through attending events such as the TUC Conference.

In 2008 the network sent representatives to various equality conferences, and supported an amendment to a motion on “Two-ticks” to the TUC Congress.

Common themes and topics

In 2009, meetings covered such issues as “Two-ticks”, monitoring issues, improving awareness and training, including working for a better understanding of neuro-diversity, mental health, and other invisible conditions. In 2010, the network will be supporting a new disability awareness course for FDA Reps and considering the impact of the recession on the working conditions and recruitment and retention of disabled people.

How often does the network meet?

Approximately every three months at FDA Head Office, and at other locations if there is sufficient support.

Why join?

Becoming a network member gives you the opportunity to develop a wide range of new contacts in your professional life, influence peer groups, shape union policy, and get involved in raising awareness of disability issues and campaigning for changes in the workplace.

Women's Network

All women members of the FDA are welcome to join the network, which meets regularly to discuss gender issues and what can be done about the continuing under-representation of women at the top of the civil service. We also provide mutual support and encouragement, and help to develop policies on issues such as childcare, flexible working and maternity rights.

Disabled Members Network

The FDA's Disabled Members Network is open to all members who consider themselves disabled or have an interest in disability issues. We try to meet informally every three months or so, to discuss ways to improve opportunities for disabled people at work, raise awareness, promote better training and tackle discrimination. We promote the inclusion of disabled people in the civil service and wider society.

LGBT

Lesbian Gay Bisexual and Transgender Network

The FDA's LGBT Network provides an instant network of colleagues who share interests and sensitivities, and provides support in dealing with hostility at work. Through the FDA, we work to give lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender people a voice in the same corridors of power where they often have to be silent as individuals.

Black and Minority Ethnic Network

The network aims to raise the profile of black and minority ethnic members and ensure our voice is heard within the FDA. We meet regularly to discuss issues at work, provide mutual social and professional support, and help develop policies to promote a fairer and more diverse workplace.

fast stream

Fast Stream

The FDA is the union for fast streamers. We work to protect and promote your pay, benefits and professional interests as the future of the public service. The FDA has sole recognition for fast stream members and the FDA's Fast Stream Network is a vibrant and active group that meets regularly for many work and social events.

lawyers

Lawyers

The Lawyers Network is a formal constituency of the union, and has its own voice on the national Executive Committee through two elected representatives. It meets regularly, in meetings which are open to all lawyer members, and liaises with the Government Legal Service (GLS) on issues relating to GLS lawyers.

statisticians & economists

Statisticians and Economists Forum

The FDA is the voice of statisticians and economists in the civil service, and particularly of senior staff. Membership provides excellent networking opportunities. Many senior statisticians and economists in the SCS are members. We work closely with both the Government Statistical Service (GSS) and the Government Economic Service (GES) on issues affecting our members at work.
